# Tom's Part:

Bill addressed questions he had received about paying for the Oregon Cabaret Show in Ashland by informing the group that Ralph Pockress would be taking payment after he returns on May 15<sup>th</sup>. Bill reviewed the flyer saying there were possibly three options on this run. Option 1 Ashland, Option 2 Brandon and a possible Option 3 to Fort Bragg.
