RCCS Business Meeting Minutes (July 2, 2015)

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. by Tom Mason.

June Minutes were recognized and approved, 1st by Anne Dunbar and 2nd by Jim Bartylla.

Treasurer's Report – Rick Sutter - The Treasurer's Report was given by Rick and was recognized by the membership. Rick thanked everyone for their kindness and for those who attended the memorial for Marge.

Visitors and New Members- Rosie Bjornsen – Rosie welcomed back and held membership votes for Hope Bickford, Tim and Kathy Wright, Ken Sousa, and Joe and Teresa Licastro. All were voted in by the membership without opposition. Rosie then announced 13 July birthdays.

Ralph and Dodie Pockress were thanked for bringing the birthday goodies for the July meeting.

Ed and Anne Dunbar volunteered to bring birthday goodies for the August meeting.

Tom's Part:

Tom announced the resignation of Nash Dhillon, Vice President, from RCCS in order to concentrate on his business efforts, and that Nash had already sold his Corvette.

Tom provided some critical information to members from an article he had found about how a man and his dog died from heat exhaustion, because he could not open his Corvette door due to a dead battery which kept the electronic door handle from working. Tom encouraged members who own electronic door opening Corvettes to be sure they are familiar

with the emergency exit directions contained within their owner's manuals. In most cars, there are levers on both the driver and passenger sides as well as in the trunk, which will open the doors or trunk. Additionally, it was noted that most late model Corvettes have easily removable roof panels, which could also be used as an emergency exit access.

Tom shared the latest information on the current room rates at the Dante Club. He said the larger room at the front of the building in which past club meetings and parties were held has jumped in cost to \$600 per night with the smaller side room at the front as well as the smaller room at the back now renting for \$500 per meeting or party. By negotiating, Tom said he was able to rent the front smaller meeting room for \$350 per meeting or party without a contract.

Other locations, such as the Carmichael Elks, all want to have a guaranteed bar purchase of \$175 per event plus the cost of the room rent. Other locations are still being investigated by Tom and RCCS Board Members. Tom shared that the Dante Club has refurbished all of the meeting rooms and has continued to have great meals for our dinner parties and has improved their wine offerings. Tom said we will continue to have meetings and parties in the smaller front room. HOWEVER, Tom also reported that the Annual (38th) Club Birthday Party Luau, scheduled for August 29th, will be held inside in the BIG ROOM and will be free to paid members.

Tom announced the nominees for club Officers: Robert Ramirez and Charity Smith are running for President; Ron Kayl is running for Vice President; Rick Sutter is running for Treasurer; and Keri Berkler is running for Secretary. Voting will be held at the August 6th club meeting. Absentee ballots will be sent out with the July Newsletter and must be received not later than August 4th club meeting to be counted in the vote.

Raffle: Peter Bradt introduced the new Raffle Crew Don and Sue Hess and Dave Bull and Heidi Goodman, and at that time the new raffle crew did the first round of raffles. Tonight's Vannas were Charity Smith and her sister Hope Bickford who just renewed her RCCS membership.

Lunch on the way up was at the Hi-Lo Café in Weed. They had a hospitality gathering that evening with no expenses spared for the Margarita Bartender, Rick's grandson. Rick said due to the high heat the Bureau of Recreation shut down the white water brunch run to 36 miles. The high-speed boat ride was great with a second boat helping to make the river water splash over the boat riders with the winner for the "most drenched/drowned rat award" being given to our very own Jeanie Kayl. Dinner was great with Cathy Quigg providing a floor show. Rick said he hoped everyone attending had a great time, because he and his grandson sure had fun.

Upcoming Events:

July 12th – 15th Ashland – Bandon – Fortuna Run - Ralph Pockress and Bill Abbey

The group will depart July 12th at the Carl's Junior at Northgate and I-80 at approximately 9:30 a.m. Ralph and Bill said there would be handouts during the drivers meeting with the itinerary and directions. They said they have 14 rooms booked at Ashland with approximately 13 cars ending at Fortuna. Ralph said it may be hot in Ashland and much cooler in Bandon and Fortuna. When making room reservations for each hotel, be sure to say you are with the River City Corvette Club. The run will start in Ashland for two nights (July 12th and 13th) at the Ashland Springs Hotel 1-541-488-1700, where rooms are \$169 per night plus tax. A group dinner is planned for the first night and on the second night there will be a dinner/dessert show for \$67.50 per person or \$135 per couple. Make checks for the dinner/show payable to Ralph Pockress. The show will be held at the Oregon Cabaret Theater, presenting the show "Cabaret". The third day (July 14th) the group will go on to the town of Bandon (108 miles from Ashland) staying at the Bandon Inn for one night with rooms at \$138.68 with tax for a queen with bay view or king bed at \$157.94 with taxes. Call 1-800-526-0209 or 1-541-347-4417 for reservations. While in Bandon a visit is planned to a special Zoo and later there is another group dinner. On the fourth day (July 15) the run will go to Fortuna (Fortuna is 4 hours from Bandon or Bandon to Sacramento through Ashland is 8

hours) staying at the Fortuna Best Western Hotel for one night at \$107.90 for one king bed or \$119.99 for two queen beds. Call 1-888-554-1206 for room reservations. There is another planned group dinner in Fortuna at the Eel River Brewery. Fortuna to Sacramento is an 8 hour drive.

As an aside, Bill talked about some of the great room rates and show deals going on in Reno as long as you have a "players" card for the casinos such as the El Dorado or Peppermill. He also said drinks at the Silver Legacy are going for \$2 with a player card. He said the individual "player" cards can be obtained on line from each casino.

August 29th - The Club's 38th Birthday Party and Luau — Tom Mason repeated that the Club Birthday Luau Dinner and Club Charity Fund Raiser will be held in the smaller front room at the Dante Club and will be at no cost to paid members. Friends and family are encouraged to come at \$35 per person. Tom said information flyers about this event were on the tables at tonight's meeting. Attire is casual and members are encouraged to wear Hawaiian themed apparel. The party starts with a no host bar at 5:30 followed by Polynesian Dancers at 6 with dinner being served at 6:30. Tom reminded members that this event is a fund raising event for the club's charity, "Christmas for Kids". Tom encouraged members to donate items, especially hand crafted items, to be placed in the silent auction to help raise funds. Tom also asked members to donate desserts for a dessert silent auction. The event handout said there would be a call around and went on to say, "If you say you are coming and don't show, you will be charged \$35 per person."

Ed said the winery also has a million dollar fire place those participating may enjoy viewing.
