The Lodge at Riverside is located along the banks of the scenic Rogue River, just 2 miles from Interstate 5, in downtown Grants Pass. The central location is convenient to Hellgate Jetboat Excursions, downtown shopping, Historic G Street and Applegate & Rogue Valley wineries. Day trips to Crater Lake National Park and the Oregon Caves National Monument are easily accessible. The Lodge at Riverside offers oversized guestrooms and suites, most with private patios or balconies facing the Rogue River.
